

The Benefits of Using Worm Tea

Worm Tea will outperform ANY chemical fertilizer known , increasing both plant size and yield. This is due to the synergy developed as the Worm Tea interacts with the microbes and protozoa in the soil as well as the root of the plant itself. The organisms contained in it produce all the hormones, vitamins, nutrients, enzymes, amino acids and minerals needed for plants in all stages to thrive.

Worm Tea should be used for inoculating potting soil when starting new plants or seedlings as well as remedial treatment for any plants or shrubs that are growing in soil that has been damaged by prolonged chemical treatments. Worm Tea is natural and will never burn or damage plants or soil.

The microbes in Worm Tea turn any organic matter that exists currently in the soil into humus, effectively storing energy for later use. This is a basic component of soil fertility.

Chemicals

Worm Tea is not only a good source of nutrients for your plants, it is alive, containing a variety of beneficial bacteria and fungi that help improve the soil and anything planted in it. For this reason it should be used as soon after it is brewed as possible.

For best results, apply it every 2-4 weeks. Use a watering can to drench soil as usual around the drip zone of the plants. You can apply full strength or dilute with 50% water.

For houseplants use a pressurized sprayer or bottle to apply to leaves until dripping, both top and bottom. Apply early morning or late evening for best results.

You can also apply to lawns after watering normally. Drench the area with a pressurized sprayer or watering can, diluted or full strength depending on the current condition of the turf.

You will never need to fear your young ones or pets coming in contact with areas you have recently treated.
